Alumni Profile: Yaneth

Yaneth (pictured with her boyfriend) grew up in El Salvador, the smallest and most densely populated country in Central America. When she moved to the United States and settled in Milwaukee, she never thought she would have the opportunity to be a homeowner -- that is, not until she learned about ACTS Housing from a friend.

Recently, she became the owner of a duplex city tax foreclosure in Clarke Square on the city's south side.

"Yaneth is fantastic and has been working so fast to get the house movein ready," said Ramon R. Guaddarama, an ACTS rehab specialist. "She is almost there."

Yaneth purchased the house for less than \$25,000 and will not only build equity but save more than \$300 per month compared to her current rent payment. With the help of ACTS, Yaneth and her boyfriend are working overtime to turn



this abandoned house into a home.

"I worked very hard to save the money to buy this house," she said. "It feels great to be a homeowner. I am proud of what I have accomplished. I feel more secure in myself because of what I have done."

She can't wait for the day when she will be able to host her entire extended family: "My house is large enough that rest of my family can stay here when they visit," she said. "It will be a good place for everyone to have family time."

Yaneth believes the transformation of her new house can have a cascading effect on the entire neighborhood. "When I am done it is going to look nice," she

said. "I think this will inspire my neighbors to make their homes look better. It will benefit the whole community."

Partner Spotlight: PyraMax Bank

Gary White, community development manager for Pyra-Max Bank, still remembers the first time he visited ACTS Housing's office in the former rectory of St. Michael's Parish.

"Sometimes you see a non-profit agency with a stated goal to do good, and the offices and surroundings are as opulent as a large bank or law firm," he said. "You could tell right away that ACTS Housing was not spending its money on expensive offices and surroundings, and it's true to this day. They're not there for the paychecks; they're committed to the cause. This is an agency that gets it and truly makes a difference."

White said that ACTS Housing is skilled at identifying people who have what it takes to be responsible home owners, even if they don't have long established credit or are dealing with a language barrier.

"ACTS takes people who may not be comfortable with the banking system and helps put them on the path toward homeownership," he said. "ACTS has been invaluable in reaching out to the communities where we don't have a branch footprint. Without ACTS, we wouldn't be able to connect with these families."

Nou Yeng Lee, whose family emigrated from Laos more than three decades ago, realized even as a teenager that the United States is the land of opportunity. Nou Yeng and his family (pictured) also believe Milwaukee is a city of opportunity, and with good reason. Thanks to their work ethic and diligence, Nou Yeng, his wife Linda, and their children are the proud owners of a home on 18th St. and Vine. Nou Yeng was so impressed with the support provided by

ACTS Housing during his journey from renter to owner that he applied for a job as a rehab specialist.

ACTS Housing moved quickly to hire him.

"Nou Yeng applies the same determination to his job at ACTS as he did during the home-buying process," said Michael Gosman. "His previous experience as a draftsman and his practical approach to rehab is of immense benefits to the families who are becoming homeowners."

As a rehab specialist, Nou Yeng represents families during

coordination and execution of rehab plans, with a focus on the reclamation of vacant, vandalized foreclosures. One of the Nou Yeng's most important responsibilities is assisting homebuyers with the creation of an itemized list of all repairs and improvements that will be required for safe, sanitary and

affordable owner-occupancy. From there, He supports families throughout the rehab project.

"What I like about the work is that we help people fix up and own homes that people have given up on," Nou Yeng said. "We are helping to make Milwaukee a beautiful place again."
