DEDICATED AND ON DISPLAY: HORACIO'S HOME

Upon meeting Horacio, it's evident he's proud of his home. He proudly displays the home's progress on his Snapchat. Sitting cozy on Milwaukee's north side, he and members of his family (including his 74-year-old grandfather) have been working hard on the home rehab: insulation, finishing walls, pulling up carpets and refinishing the original hardwood floors.

"It's been a lot of work," he said, "but we're almost finished." He worked for five months getting the home code compliant after purchasing it for \$3,500 in May. The family moved in in

September.

Horacio hopes to complete the cosmetic rehab projects in another six months. Previously, Horacio and his wife Maria rented a small two-bedroom apartment. Living in a 4-bedroom, single-family house has taken some adjustment.

"Sometimes it feels like it's too *big*," he said. The neighborhood has them smitten. Horacio knows his neighbors: a janitor to the right of him and a third-shift worker to the left. "This area is good," he said, "and guiet."

AN ACTS MILESTONE: 2500 HOMEOWNERS

ACTS celebrated our 2,500th homeowner with our long-term supporter Steinhafels this month. Neva and Robert Gaines moved into their new home in Milwaukee's Sherman Park neighborhood in October after working with ACTS for a year. They received a warm welcome to their new neighborhood from the Sherman Park Neighbhorhood Association, Steinhafels, and their local community members. The Gaines' home is the 25th house in the Sherman Park

neighborhood to be purchased by an ACTS family in the past five years.

When commended on their hard work over the past year, Neva said *"It takes a lot of faith, and a lot of sacrifice"*.

Steinhafels Vice President, Andrew Steinhafel, also participated in the Gaines family's festivities and provided them with a \$500 gift certificate to furnish their new home. *"The work ACTS does and the work the homeowners put into their new home, it's a really holistic program and it's pretty incredible,"* said Andrew. *"We're just happy to support it."*

ACTS is on track to help 130 families transition from renter to homeowner this year, turning houses to homes, and blocks to communities, and we can't do it without hardworking families like the Gaines family and dedicated supporters like Steinhafels.

MEET THE ACTS TEAM:

YUSSUF MURSAL, ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT

Yussuf Mursal, 36, just hit his six-week milestone as an employee of ACTS. He says he is enjoying his time here.

"Everything I do here I like," he said. "I have never had such a warm welcome and people to support me and show me how I can do a better job."

Yussuf works as ACTS' administrative assistant which often requires him to interface one-on-one with interested homebuyers. It is a natural fit for him.

Yussuf, too, is an ACTS homeowner and was a featured speaker at ACTS' very first Longest Neighborhood Table fundraiser.

"We like it here," he said of himself and his family who immigrated from Somalia in 2004.

They fled the country's civil war and he recalls that they walked to the refugee camp in Kenya. It took 17 days.

His experience as a refugee has carved a lane for him professionally. Up until six weeks ago, he worked as Lead Case Manager at Catholic Charities of SE Wisconsin where he helped other people who were immigrating resettle in Milwaukee.

Yussuf continues to assist the Somali community in Milwaukee, and gets them on the path to

homeownership. Recent ACTS orientations have boasted at least one referral from Yussuf.

"I like helping people," he said. "Your neighborhood is where you get back to normal and say 'this is my starting point in life."
